JUSTICE MINISTRY UPDATE

We had a great year for justice at First Congregational United Church of Christ! We gathered 104 strong at the Nehemiah Action in April. Along with 2,400 other people of faith from all over Palm Beach County, we asked our county commissioners to support our efforts to curtail youth arrests, provide support for an id system for undocumented immigrants, and provide support to help end homelessness in Palm Beach County. Only five of seven commissioners chose to participate, and only two of those commissioners gave their unqualified support to everything we asked. However, a good conversation was had and our officials know that we are not going away until justice is carried out!

At the Justice Ministry Celebration held in May, our church was awarded the Micah 6:8 award for turning out the largest percentage of our average worship attendance to the Nehemiah Action. Our Justice Ministry Network Members also invested over \$5,100 in PEACE Justice ministry!

PLARN MATS FOR THE HOMELESS

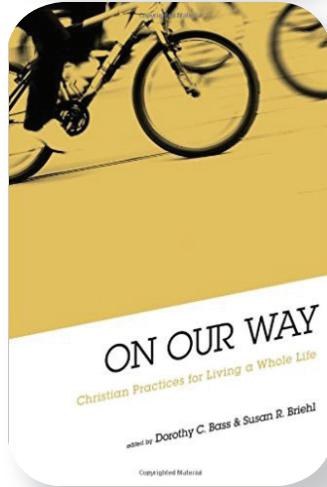

MAY: MENTAL HEALTH MONTH

May was designated Mental Health Awareness Month over 50 years ago to raise awareness about good mental health for everyone and to break the stigma for those coping with mental illness. Mental illnesses are common and treatable. In fact, one in four people will suffer from some form of mental illness in any given year, but many people have symptoms that are misunderstood and go undiagnosed in early stages. Many avoid seeking help because they are not sure where to get help and they fear discrimination and stigma.



The Renewal Book Club chose *Blessed Are the Crazy* by Sarah Griffith Lund as their book of the month, because it is a memoir by a Disciples of Christ minister on her experience living with mental illness in her family. The monthly meeting held on the second Tuesday in the parlor was open to all who wished to discuss this important topic.

On Sunday, May 21, we had a mental health resources display in our Fellowship Hall during the Coffee Hour. Carol Lewis, a FL. Licensed Marriage & Family Therapist, who has been providing counseling at our church and at Faith United Methodist Church in

Boynton Beach, will had materials from the National Alliance on Mental Illness, Mental Health America, and the Community Christian Counseling Center.

For the past thirty-five years, our church has been one of fourteen host churches for the Samaritan Counseling Centers of South Florida with its administrative office in Fort Lauderdale. This spring we changed our counseling relationship from the Center in Fort Lauderdale to the the Community Christian Counseling Center, a Samaritan Center affiliate in North Palm Beach. This will provide more opportunities to work cooperatively to serve those in need in our congregation and community.

In addition, we also our fortunate to have Rev. Dr. John Button in our congregation. Dr. Button is a therapist in private practice. You can find him online at <http://westpalmtherapy.com/>.
